



United Women Helping Others


The 2023 United Women Helping






Coldest Night of the Year

Edwin Binney's Community Farm and Education Centre

2023 was a tough year at Edwin Binney's Community Farm & Education Centre. On August 3rd the farm found itself in the path of a destructive downburst that dropped golf ball sized hail and leveled many of the crops. Lost to the storm were 20 fruit trees, many rows of corn, and much of the cabbages.

Thankfully we are a part of one of the most generous and hard working communities around. BGC and other community members rallied quickly to help clean up after the storm, allowing us to replant the fields to salvage a fall harvest.



Edwin Binney's Community Farm and Education Centre

Though the weather was tumultuous the determination of all involved with the farm ensured there were still many successes. The farm produced 18,366lbs of fresh produce worth \$52,202 which went to community agencies to support well over 4,000 community members. The farm also hosted 620 children and youth to participate in Field to Table Programming and educational workshops.

We're looking forward to the 2024 season and expecting a lot of growth to occur in and out of the farm. New projects coming this season are the seed garden, more raised bed space to extend the season, and increasing the biodiversity by adding new pollinator, sensory, and rain gardens.
